Along the way and in addition to Lynda's pics, some of us took the opportunity for a few selfies.... always tricky trying to get your best side all in the photo!


At the end of the ride, after getting off their gear, and a lovely cool hose off, some members made great use of Lynda and Ken's sand area for a little cosmetic readjustments...






Thanks to everyone who participated on the ride and again to Lynda and Ken for organising it!

Upcoming comps include Tamworth

Horse Extravaganza again at the AELEC. This is
a big equine event attracting over 600 riders
in various disciplines.

Claudia has also qualified for the Pony Club State Championships at Denman in July, where she will represent 'Zone 5' in show jumping, against the best Pony Club riders from around the state.

This is followed by the winter Show jumping Championships again at the AELEC in July.

All these activities help to keep both Claudia and her family very busy indeed. (And broke).

Claudia's last comp was at the Quirindi ODE in March where she did a lovely dressage test, scoring well, jumped a lovely clear round in the show jumping, and went beautifully in the XC (however was eliminated for jumping a 'B' grade jump ① ③ out of the water).

Claudia was unphased by this and thoroughly enjoyed the comp and is looking forward to the year ahead.

Her goals for the near future are for State Championships in eventing next year, and to progress up to 'B' grade in show jumping and 80cm in eventing.

When there are no comps on Claudia loves to give Lenny some relaxing down time out on the trail with the club.

And her Mum even gets a ride too!!
