When did I start riding?

Mum and dad moved to a 5 acre block at Kenthurst when I was in 1st year high school so I started nagging my parents to get a horse. I had been reading horsey books for years and years.

My horses:

Ginger Meggs was a Chestnut with an unfortunate roman nose. He cost \$150.00 and came with a bridle only, so I rode him bareback until we could afford a stock saddle (sorry, I have only one photo of him and I can't find it).

He might not have been the prettiest horse, but he was as safe as houses. A girlfriend and I used to ride all around Kenthurst all the time.

Then was a mad mare called Binatang who I bought from a girl at high school, eek no more mares for me lol. She ended up tossing me off lots and the last time she ran up our road, up Kenthurst Road to Round Corner, she was sent off to the sales, unfortunately, when we finally caught her.

No more horses over the HSC, nursing and early married days until I started helping at RDA at Kenthurst which is now Hills Grammar.

Still no horses while kids were young. We lived in the burbs. When Yara was the same age I was with my first horse, we moved to 10 acres at Richmond, she then got a horse, I got the float and became the transporter.

Once she was fairly self-sufficient I was able to finally get a horse to ride. I leased an Arab gelding called Maggsie and did my first dressage test. I was in my late 40's by then.

Maggsie's lease ended. I then bought a thoroughbred called Robbie (sold him to a pony clubber after a few years). I joined Hoofbeats Adult Riding Club where I was on the committee forever and did lots of gymkhanas, dressage days and trail rides. Tried an OTTThoroughbred and then sold him on as a showjumper. Then there was an Arab called Chevi. He sadly went to heaven at 24 with a rotated pedal bone , and then Beep who also went to heaven on 8

February 2021 at the age of 24 as well \bigotimes , you may have met us on trail rides.

Now I have Donny, a 14-year-old Anglo, a show/dressage pony who I am trying to turn into a trail horse.

I've been extremely lucky to have been able to have horses for such a long time... *a girl's dream come true*.

How to Pay Your Membership

The old system is no longer operative as ATHRA has recently launched a whole New Member Registration system which means your ATHRA number is also no longer used. The new Gameday system will only recognise you through the email address you list when registering. Unfortunately ATHRA were unable to export over 4000 current members over the new system, so when you are renewing you are actually creating a new member profile of yourself within the new Gameday site.

<u>Steps</u> (have an up to date profile photo of yourself ready to download)

Login into the ATHRA site.

Click on the "**Membership**" tab.

Select our Club, 'Hills & Hawkesbury'.

Follow all the prompts up to the payment section.

Once you have completed your 2022 membership the system will send you a payment conformation email.

When you receive that email you will notice down in the bottom right side this email address nagn_15023@athra.com.au.

Click on that email address. It will automatically send the club confirmation of your 2022 membership.

\$120.00 is the 'new' rejoining fee. \$100.00 to ATHRA, \$20.00 to Hills & Hawkesbury.

Buck Brannaman Tips

- DON'T nag, annoy or get emotional
- Killing aids constant pulling on the mouth and banging legs at the same time
- Drop nose bands bad mechanics, breathing disability, lack of oxygen, aggressive behaviour, anxious DON'T FIX THE MOUTH, FIX THE FEET
- Don't have a rigid body
- Keep your horse moving
- Keep your horse lively
- At stressful times don't turn in a circle during a time of distress, face the problem head on
- Blind spot at rear when turning, only makes your horse more anxious
- Leaving a halter under the bridle

 it's like having TOILET PAPER UP YOUR ARSE! OR DOG POO ON YOUR BOOT!!

(I went to a Buck clinic in Tamworth – these are some notes... don't shoot the messenger!)



Horse Are Vehicles

In 1916 horses were deemed as vehicles and still are to this day.

So what we have to remember is

- When riding our horses on the roads, unless it is not practical, we should ride on the same side of the road as if driving a motorised vehicle.
- We should abide by all road rules.
- We should NOT BE USING MOBILE PHONES.
- We should not be over the legal alcohol limit.Just something to think about.
