T.H.C.R.A /A.T.H.R.A. RIDE RULES

- Riders must obey the instructions from the Trail Boss and Stewards at all times. Permission must be obtained to ride in front of the Ride leader or behind the Drag rider.
- During a ride keep the rider in front of you and the rider behind you in sight.
- Keep your horse out of kicking distance of other horses.
- It is recommended that horses be adequately shod as determined by the Ride organiser.
- DO NOT pass other riders at a speed that may excite their mount.
- The ride must not be left without the knowledge and permission of a ride officer.
- No pets or firearms allowed on rides or camps.
- During a ride the blood alcohol level must not exceed .05 to comply with state road rules. No alcohol to be taken on trail rides.
- All gates are to be left as they are found. All property, private, crown or state owned, is to be respected and left as found with all litter removed.
- Riders under 18 must wear a regulation helmet.
- Riders are required to register their participation in the trail ride. For safety reasons, please do not bring your horse with you when attending the registration desk.

This is an abridged version of the High Country Riders Rules. A full set of rules is available from the Club Secretary.
