Bullengarook – Wombat Forest. Sun 21st July 2013

This ride will start from the Bullengarook Rec Reserve and ride into the Wombat Forest. Riding will be on sandy/gravel, roads and tracks with terrain being flat to undulating and there will be some hilly sections but not daunting. Anticipated return to floats will be around 2:30pm where tea and coffee will be available.

- Horses are to be reasonably fit, with feet adequately conditioned and / or shod.
- Stallions by approval only.
- Breastplates and Cruppers are recommended.
- Horses known to kick must wear a red ribbon in their tail.
- Under 18's must wear an approved riding helmet.
- Riders under 16 must be under adult supervision and have a signed approval.
- RCTHRC recommends that all riders have Ambulance cover.
- Dogs are not permitted on the ride itself but when in the float parking area must be on a lead at all times.
- All riders must adhere to the RCTHRC rules which incorporate the ATHRA Code of Conduct.
- All riders must advise the Ride Leader of any medical condition prior to the commencement of the ride.

Ride out time 10:00am.

Expression of Interest needed

The committee with the help of Mark Chircop are looking at running a 2 day camp ride at the "Boomerang Ranch" in Daylesford on the weekend of August 10^{th} & 11^{th} , this will be the first time the club has run a ride from this location, although many of our members attended a ride there last year run by John Littler (RCTHRC Member) and from all reports had an absolute ball, all were very complimentary about the Ranch accommodation, facility's and the riding in the area.

The Boomerang Ranch is fully self-contained holiday ranch and has full amenities, so rather than sleeping in your float you can enjoy the Ranch accommodation at no extra charge,

there is a full functional kitchen, bathroom, dinning room and so much more, here is their web site www.boomerangranch.com.au I suggest you take the time and have a look for yourself, the cost will be \$25 per person per night and half price for kids under 15, at this stage we plan on a Saturday ride to the local Pub for lunch and a shorter ride on the Sunday.
